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RESOLUTION 2017-33

RESOLUTION DECLARING THE BRIAN K. SMITH WORKHOUSE AS A SEPARATE WORKHOUSE TO BE OPERATED UNDER THE ADMINISTRATIVE CONTROL OF THE BRADLEY COUNTY SHERIFF, ESTABLISHING THE WORKHOUSE DISCIPLINARY REVIEW BOARD, INSTITUTING A WORK RELEASE PROGRAM AT THE WORKHOUSE AND CREATING A WORK RELEASE COMMISSION, ESTABLISHING THE ORDER OF DISBURSEMENTS FROM THE WAGES OR SALARY OF EMPLOYED PRISONERS, ESTABLISHING OTHER ADDITIONAL WORKHOUSE CHARGES AND AUTHORIZING THE SHERIFF AND MAYOR TO ENTER INTO A MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

WHEREAS, the County Legislative Body is authorized and empowered pursuant to *Tenn. Code Ann. 41-2-101* to establish, construct and maintain stationary workhouses, as the Legislative Body in their discretion and wisdom deems advisable for the best interest of Bradley County; and

WHEREAS, the Bradley County Commission approved the funding and construction of the Bradley County Workhouse and on July 18, 2016, officially named the Bradley County Workhouse the "Brian K. Smith Workhouse"; and

WHEREAS, the Brian K. Smith Workhouse will be completed and available for inmate occupancy in July of 2017; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to *Tenn. Code Ann. 41-2-104(h)(1)(B)*, any county may, upon recommendation by the County Mayor and a resolution passed by a two-thirds vote of the County Legislative Body, place the operation, supervision and control of the County Workhouse under the administrative control of the County Sheriff; and

WHEREAS, Bradley County is required to establish a workhouse "Disciplinary Review Board" composed of six impartial members, one or more of whom may be members of the Workhouse staff; and

WHEREAS, Bradley County may institute a Work Release Program at the Brian K. Smith Workhouse in accordance with the provisions of *Tenn. Code Ann. 41-2-127 41-2-141* and must establish a "Work Release Commission" that is authorized and empowered to permit prisoners to leave the workhouse during approved working hours to work at a place of employment and to earn a living to meet in whole or in part the cost of the prisoner's current financial obligations; and

WHEREAS, *Tennessee Code Annotated 41-4-142* authorizes Bradley County, by resolution adopted by a two-thirds vote of the County Commission, to establish and implement a plan authorizing the workhouse superintendent to charge an inmate committed to the County Workhouse a fee, not to exceed the actual cost, for items issued to the inmate upon each new admission to the County Workhouse; and

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RESOLUTION 2017-33 CONTINUES

WHEREAS, *Tennessee Code Annotated 41-4-142* authorizes Bradley County, by resolution adopted by a two-thirds vote of the County Commission, to establish and implement a plan authorizing the workhouse superintendent to charge an inmate a nominal fee for participation in GED or other scholastic testing, escort of an inmate by correctional officers to a hospital or other health care facility to visit a family member, and escort of an inmate by correctional officers to attend funeral services of a family member.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of the Bradley County Legislative Body meeting in Regular Session at Cleveland, Tennessee, on this 17th day of July, 2017, that:

SECTION 1. Pursuant to the provisions of *Tenn. Code Ann. 41-2-104* and upon the recommendation of the County Mayor, the Brian K. Smith Workhouse is declared as a separate workhouse to be operated under the administrative control of the Bradley County Sheriff.

SECTION 2. The Brian K. Smith Workhouse "Disciplinary Review Board" is hereby established pursuant to the provisions of *Tenn. Code Ann. 41-2-111*, and shall be composed of the six (6) impartial members, one (1) or more of whom may be members of the jail or workhouse staff, serving two (2) year terms. The initial Board shall be composed of the following members:

- 1) Gary Conners
- 2) Rich Kienlen
- 3) Steve Lawson
- 4) Justin Miller
- 5) Cassandra Burgiss
- 6) Bob Gault

SECTION 3. The Brian K. Smith Workhouse is hereby authorized to establish a Work Release Program to permit certain prisoners to leave the Workhouse during reasonable and necessary hours for occupational, scholastic or medical purposes.

SECTION 4. Pursuant to the provisions of *Tenn. Code Ann. 41-2-134*, a "Work Release Commission" is hereby established with the authority to authorize prisoners to come under the Bradley County Work Release Program whenever any person has been committed to the Workhouse and to approve educational programs, and shall be composed of five (5) members serving four (4) year terms. This Commission is authorized to establish the housing and board rate for inmates, and it is recommended that said rate be established as twenty-eight dollars (\$28.00) per day that each inmate works. The initial Work Release Commission shall be composed of the following members:

- 2) Jeff Yarber
- 3) Cynda Moore
- 4) Alvin Word
- 5) Phil Staufinbill

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RESOLUTON 2017-33 CONTINUES

SECTION 5. Pursuant to the provisions of *Tenn. Code Ann. 41-2-129(c)* and by order of this Legislative Body, the wages or salaries of employed prisoners in the Work Release Program shall be disbursed for the following purposes in the order stated below:

- 1) The board of the prisoner, which shall be established by the Work Release Commission;**
- 2) Necessary travel expenses to and from work and other incidental expenses of the prisoner, as approved by the Workhouse Superintendent;**
- 3) Support of the prisoner's dependents in the amount of \$100.00 per month per dependent or as otherwise ordered by the court;**
- 4) Payment of docket costs connected with the prisoner's commitment or as otherwise ordered by the court;**
- 5) Payment either in full or ratably of the prisoner's obligations acknowledged by the prisoner in writing or that have been reduced to judgment;**
- 6) After deductions are made in accordance with (1) through (5) above, \$4, if there is at least a balance of \$4, shall be deducted each month from a prisoner's trust account for any month the prisoner is gainfully employed, to be directly applied to satisfy any judgments, against the prisoner, for restitution in favor of the victim or as otherwise ordered by the court.**

SECTION 6. Pursuant to the provisions of *Tenn. Code Ann. 41-4-142*, the Workhouse Superintendent of the Bradley County Brian K. Smith Workhouse is authorized to charge an inmate incarcerated in the Workhouse, a fee, not to exceed the actual cost, for items issued to the inmate upon each new admission to the County Workhouse. This fee shall not be construed as authorizing the county to deny necessary clothing or hygiene items to an inmate based on the inmate's inability to pay the fee authorized by this Resolution.

SECTION 7. Pursuant to the provisions of *Tenn. Code Ann. 41-4-142*, the Workhouse Superintendent of the Bradley County Brian K. Smith Workhouse is authorized to charge an inmate incarcerated in the Workhouse, five dollars (\$5.00) for providing correctional officers to escort the inmate to a funeral home or church upon the death of an immediate family member for the purpose of visitation when provided at the inmate's request.

SECTION 8. Pursuant to the provisions of *Tenn. Code Ann. 41-4-142*, the Workhouse Superintendent of the Bradley County Brian K. Smith Workhouse is authorized to charge an inmate incarcerated in the Workhouse five dollars (\$5.00) for participation in GED or other scholastic testing when provided at the inmate's request, provided that the administering agency charges a fee for each test administered.

SECTION 9. Pursuant to the provisions of *Tenn. Code Ann. 41-4-142*, the Workhouse Superintendent of the Bradley County Brian K. Smith Workhouse is authorized to charge an inmate incarcerated in the Workhouse, five dollars (\$5.00) for providing correctional officers to escort the inmate to a hospital or other health care facility for the purpose of visitation of an immediate family member when provided at the inmate's request.

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SECTION 10. The Superintendent of the Workhouse is authorized to deduct the amount of the fee authorized by Sections 6, 7, 8 and 9 of this Resolution from such inmate's workhouse trust account or any other account or fund established by or for the benefit of such inmate while incarcerated.

SECTION 11. The Bradley County Sheriff and the Bradley County Mayor are authorized to enter into a Memorandum of Understanding providing for the Office of Misdemeanor Probation to receive all funds collected from the Sheriff's Office for housing, board and administration of the Work Release Program and for all Workhouse requisitions for purchases to be submitted to the County Mayor prior to purchase.

Commissioner Jeff Yarber moves to approve this Resolution 2017-33 with two changes: 1) adding \$100.00 in Section 5 No. 3 and 2) deleting Section 11; Commissioner Howard Thompson seconds the motion.

Commissioner Dan Rawls offers a substitute motion to pull Resolution 2017-33 and table it until the Commission gets this Memorandum of Understanding before it is voted on because this changes the whole intent of the Resolution.

The substitute motion dies for lack of a second.
