Bradley County Policy on Retiring Deputy/ Service Weapon

Upon retirement, a deputy is eligible to keep, without charge, his or her service weapon after a determination by the Sheriff and approval by the County Commission. In the event that the service weapon does exceed standard issue value, the deputy will have the option to pay the valued difference in exchange for said weapon. Such a retiree would qualify if the deputy is:

- (1) Retiring honorably with at least twenty years of recognized law-enforcement service; or
- (2) Retiring with less than twenty years of service and that he or she is totally physically disabled as a result of service as a deputy or based on special circumstances as determined by the Sheriff.
- (3) Killed in the line of duty. *
- (4) An exiting Sheriff who has served the post for at least one, full term and is leaving the post honorably.

*In the even a deputy is killed in the line of duty, the family will reserve the rights to the aforementioned service weapon.
