Chairman Thomas Crye called the meeting to order.

Following the Invocation by Comunidad Hope Church Pastor Jose Pimentel, Commissioner Tim Mason led the Pledge of Allegiance.

REPORT FROM COUNTY MAYOR

County Mayor D. Gary Davis presented to the Commission for consideration a resolution appropriating one hundred seventy thousand eight hundred thirty-one dollars and thirty-eight cents (\$170,831.38) for the Sugar Creek Road water main expansion project in Bradley County to Ocoee Utility District as allowed by the conditions and terms of the American Rescue Plan Act from the funds allocated by resolution 2021-50 and authorizing the Bradley County Mayor to execute an agreement with Ocoee Utility District regarding said appropriation. Commissioner Mason placed the resolution on the October 3, 2022, voting session agenda.

Mayor Davis presented to the Commission for consideration a resolution appropriating one hundred ten thousand eight hundred ninety-seven dollars and nine cents (\$110,897.09) for the Old Parksville Road Trail water main expansion project in Bradley County to Ocoee Utility District as allowed by the conditions and terms of the American Rescue Plan Act from the funds allocated by resolution 2021-50 and authorizing the Bradley County Mayor to execute an agreement with Ocoee Utility District regarding said appropriation. Commissioner Mason placed the resolution on the October 3, 2022, voting session agenda.

Mayor Davis presented to the Commission a plan for the seventh American Rescue Plan bucket regarding the Tennessee Department of Environment and Conservation grant. PLAN RECORDED AS ATTACHMENT. Commissioner Slater placed a resolution approving the plan on the October 3, 2022, voting session agenda.
